While more discussion about the research support for their approach and their theory of education would have helped, their research into charter schools across the US have had success with similar populations was innovative and provides a sound framework for this population; while application did not strongly demonstrate local support or consultation, both the capacity interview and the public hearing showed more extensive community consultation and a responsiveness to input from the community.
